Progress

Work has continued at the Bluebell roundabout where we have excavated the verges in order to widen the carriageways and subsequently improve vehicular capacity. One section of the spinal foot / cycleway off Stourton Way has been completed except for the application of cycle and pedestrian symbols which will be applied when all sections of the route are completed.

In conjunction with Somerset County Council Highways we have assessed the impact of our work at the Bluebell roundabout on traffic and pedestrians accessing and egressing Yeovil Town FC for their forthcoming fixture with Manchester United.



Upcoming Works

Various trial excavations are being undertaken at various points along the Yeovil Western Corridor (YWC) to determine the actual position and level of existing services such as gas, electricity and water. Undertaking these investigations is intended to save time when the main roadworks commence, helping minimise disruption to road users.

One element of the scheme is to improve the traffic capacity on Preston Road Roundabout which is due to start in April. A new retaining wall is to be constructed along Preston Road and Western Avenue which will require the removal of Fir Trees located between garden boundaries and the back of the existing footway. The tree removal will take place on a weekend to minimise traffic congestion and will be undertaken towards the end of January/early February.
